

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD, MISSOURI, AMENDING SCHEDULE XV OF TITLE III OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD; AND PROHIBITING THROUGH TRAFFIC ON EATHERTON ROAD BETWEEN STATE ROUTE 109 AND STATE ROUTE CC (WILD HORSE CREEK ROAD)

WHEREAS, pursuant to § 304.120.2(1), RSMo., “Municipalities, by ordinance, may...[m]ake additional rules of the road or traffic regulations to meet their needs and traffic conditions;” and

WHEREAS, pursuant to § 315.180 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Wildwood provides that, “When the proper signs are posted prohibiting such travel, no person shall operate any motor vehicle directly between the points specified in Schedule XV of this Code along the roadways specified in Schedule XV of this Code at specified times;” and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Wildwood desires to provide improved safety at all times for residents of the City of Wildwood; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Wildwood finds and determines that prohibiting the use of certain designated streets as through traffic is necessary to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Wildwood finds and determines that prohibiting through traffic on Eatherton Road between State Route 109 to State Route CC (Wild Horse Creek Road) is necessary to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of the City.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. That Schedule XV of Title III of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Wildwood, Through Traffic Prohibited, be and is hereby amended by enacting the following restrictions:

Schedule XV. THROUGH TRAFFIC PROHIBITED

	Part of Road or Street	Regulation
Add:	Eatherton Road between State Route 109 and State Route CC (Wild Horse Creek Road)	No person shall operate any motor vehicle at any time, subject to the exception of those motor vehicle trips originating from or destined to a property

located within the
City.

Section Two. The City Traffic Engineer is hereby authorized to erect appropriate signage reflecting the regulation adopted pursuant to Section One of this Ordinance.

Section Three. Violations of the restrictions established pursuant to this Ordinance shall be prosecuted pursuant to the Traffic Code of the City of Wildwood and will be controlled and enforced by the St. Louis County Police Department pursuant to its contract with the City of Wildwood.

Section Four. Savings. Nothing contained herein shall in any manner be deemed or construed to alter, modify, supersede, supplant or otherwise nullify any other Ordinance of the City or the requirements thereof whether or not relating to or in any manner connected with the subject matter hereof, unless expressly set forth herein.

Section Five. Severability. If any term, condition, or provision of this Ordinance shall, to any extent, be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder hereof shall be valid in all other respects and continue to be effective and each and every remaining provision hereof shall be valid and shall be enforced to the fullest extent permitted by law, it being the intent of the City Council that it would have enacted this Ordinance without the invalid or unenforceable provisions. In the event of a subsequent change in applicable law so that the provision which had been held invalid is no longer invalid, said provision shall thereupon return to full force and effect without further action by the City and shall thereafter be binding.

Section Six. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
