## Background Information >>>

Due to the nature of the Coronavirus Pandemic, during the majority of 2020 and into the first several months of 2021, virtual and contactless programming was offered by the City of Wildwood. Throughout the pandemic, the City of Wildwood adhered to St. Louis County's Department of Health's guidelines. As the County's guidelines have been relaxed, the City is slowly phasing out virtual programs, and, has now, begun planning in-person activities and events. After tonight's meeting, the City Council will no longer provide an update on virtual recreation programs.

10. Annual Photography Contest 2020 (one hundred one (101) photographs submitted, fifteen (15) winning photographs selected)
11. Virtual Frozen Feet Half Marathon 2021 (fifty-four (54) participants)
12. The 25th Anniversary Community Cookbook (January 25, 2021) (fifty (50) recipes submitted)
13. Spring Egg PickUp 2021 (1,040 bags of eggs handed out – over five hundred (500) cars were served over the two (2) hour event period)
14. Cabin Fever Hiking Challenge, February to April 2021. Three-hundred seventy-eight (378) participants completed Hike #1, three-hundred thirty-one (331) participants completed Hike #2, and two-hundred eighty-four (284) participants completed Hike #3.
15. Arbor Day Tree Seedling Giveaway, over three-hundred (300) tree seedlings were handed out.
16. Storybook Walk, implemented in the fall of 2020 along the trail at Community Park.
17. Senior Yoga – Online, one hundred twelve (112) online classes offered.
