### **Planning and Development:**

1. The Department was advised this week by the provider of the interactive mapping service that is hosted on the City's website that it will no longer be offering this service. This situation is not unexpected, given the poor level of service the City has been receiving from this provider over the past several years. The Department has been discussing this issue with the company since the beginning of the year. Fortunately, Ms. Rippetoe has been working on creating a replacement option that will be better for residents for the future and at significant cost savings.
2. The Planning and Zoning Commission has two (2) major residential proposals under review and discussion at its meeting on Monday, June 5, 2023. These proposals are located on both sides of Crestview Drive. These proposals have generated a substantial amount of input from surrounding neighbors. The larger of two (2) proposals submitted by McBride Homes is being considered for a vote on the Department's recommendation.
3. The City's van appears to have a major issue relating to its transmission, which required it to be towed to a local vehicle repair facility. The determination of cost, given the van is over seventeen (17) years old, will first be made, before making a decision to repair it or pursue an already allocated amount for a new vehicle that was set aside in the 2023 Capital Improvements Budget.

**Parks and Recreation:**

1. The new covered swing set will be installed during the week of June 5, 2023 at Anniversary Park. The old set is to be disassembled and the Department is investigating a new location for it. That swing set remains in good condition and would be a nice addition to an existing park. The decision in this regard will be presented to the Planning and Parks Committee for action this June. Also, the new roof was completed last week on the pavilion.
2. The Green Rock Trail Challenge will be held tomorrow, Saturday, June 3, 2023, at Greensfelder Park. The hike is seven plus (7+) miles in length and follows a route that is beautiful and challenging at the same time.
3. The Department will be hosting a Pop Up Event at Community Park on Wednesday, June 7, 2023, from 10:00am to 11:00am. The event is for children and will offer arts, crafts, and other fun activities, along with light snacks and drinks.
4. The next concert is scheduled for Friday, June 16, 2023. The group performing will be Griffin and the Gargoyles. All summer concerts start at 6:45 p.m. and are held this year in the large field located just to the east of B&B Theatre.
5. The winners from the Plein Air Event the City held on May 6, 2023 by a panel of judges and cash awards, courtesy the B&B Theatre, will be awarded in a short ceremony at City Hall on Wednesday, June 14, 2023.
6. The Farmers Market began this past Saturday, May 27, 2023. The market hosted over forty (40) vendors, a record for opening day and was crowded for most of its four (4) hours of operation. The Farmers Market will now operate between this weekend until Saturday, October 2, 2023.

**Public Works:**

1. T. Hill Construction milled and asphalt patched in various Wards this week. This work will continue over the next several weeks.
2. T. Hill Construction also replaced sidewalks and vertical curbs in Ward 5 this week.
3. Gerstner Electric began the final installation of the poles and rectangular rapid flashing beacons at our crosswalks on Strecker Road at Timber Ridge Estates Dr. and Englebrook Dr on Friday, June 2, 2023.

**Economic Development:**

1. St. Croix Hospice, LLC (16759 Main St, Suite 208) is planning to open on June 5, 2023. The Department will be coordinating with their marketing manager to plan a ribbon cutting ceremony. More info to come.
2. Elaine Rosi Academy for Children (1725 Hwy 109) has officially closed. The Department has confirmed that the owner is looking to retire and sell the property. The property has limited uses, but it could be used for another preschool facility.

3. The Wildwood Business Association will be hosting its 2023 Food Truck Festival on June 11, 2023, from 12:00pm to 4:00pm. The event will be held in the field east of the B&B Theatre on the corner of Taylor Rd and Main St. The Department spoke with WBA President, Jenny Goskie, and she stated that they are expecting over 1,500 attendees.

**St. Louis County Police Department – Wildwood Precinct:**

1. The Police Department has initiated a new crime lead link allowing citizens to provide information regarding quality of life or crime concerns to the police for review and examination. This portal is designed to allow residents to report non emergency quality of life crimes such as speeding, illegal dumping, suspicious activity, or abandoned vehicles. **Administration:**

1. The Department invested \$4,500,000.00 of City funds into 3 CD’s. Specifically, the Department invested \$2,000,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Sales Tax Fund, 2,000,000.00 from the Escrow Fund, and \$500,000.00 from the East TGA Fund. These investments will mature on December 1, 2023. The City is yielding 5.20% from these investments. These CD’s are backed by Letters of Credit from the Federal Home Loan Banks (FHLB).
2. Waste Connections Update: The Department has been coordinating with Waste Connections to ensure that they are getting caught up on waste collections in the City. Currently, complaints have decreased, and Waste Connections is claiming that they’ve caught up.
3. Waste Hauler Agreements: The City has sent out drafts of the Waste Hauler agreements to Republic Services and Gateway Disposal. The Department will be meeting with representatives from Republic Services and Gateway Disposal to iron out some of the final details. Overall, the City is on track to have both agreements ready for the City Council meeting on June 12, 2023. More info to come.
4. The Department spoke with the City’s legislative consultant, and he provided the following update on the Water Erosion Funding.

- a. HB 19 was delivered to the Governor on May 30th. Mr. Silverman reached out to Alex Tuttle, the Governor's Budget Director, to see if there is any more information he needs from the City. Mr. Tuttle did confirm that the Office of Administration reached out to me on his behalf, and he believes he has enough information before going over the budget bill.

### **Planning and Development:**

1. The Department of Planning will be processing the final set of plans for the new building at the Community College's Wildwood Campus in the next week or so. The issue that has been delaying this approval related to the extension of potable water to the site, which would need to meet current standards, while not impacting existing conditions, but rather improve on them (if at all possible). The agreed opinion design appears to have been resolved by the St. Louis Community College, Missouri American Water Company, Metro West Fire Protection District, and the City, which is part of a larger long term plan for upgrades in water service into this area.
2. The two (2), new residential projects that are to be located on current Crestview Drive are both scheduled for the Planning and Zoning Commission's meeting on June 5, 2023. The Department posted over a dozen signs in this area, but was proceeded by an email sent to many of the surrounding property owners advising them of such and the reasons for the signage and their respective numbers.

### **Parks and Recreation:**

1. The first concert in the 'Music on Main' Summer Concert Series was canceled last Friday due to storms and wet field conditions. The next concert is scheduled for Friday, June 16, 2023, and the band will be Griffin and the Gargoyles. This band played at last year's Back To School Party and was very popular and had a great stage persona.

2. The next City sponsored recreation event is the always popular Green Rock Trail Challenge. The event is held entirely in Greensfelder Park and consists of a seven (7) mile hike on natural surface trails. Lunch is offered, as part of the \$20.00 fee. Spaces still remain, so come on out and enjoy Wildwood on National Trails Day!
3. The Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at Bluff View Park was held on Monday, May 22<sup>d</sup>, at 6:00pm, and by all measures was a great success. A good group of City Council Members were in attendance and Gateway Off Road Cyclist (GORC) were out in force and helped make the evening perfect. Interim City Administrator Lee livestreamed the ribbon cutting on Facebook. You can view this livestream of the event by going to the City's Facebook Page.
4. The Farmers Market begins this Saturday, May 27, 2023, at 8:00am. The Market Manager, Natalie McAvoy, will have a full house of vendors to start the year. The market is open until 12:00pm. (Noon).

#### **Public Works:**

1. T. Hill Construction milled and asphalt patched in various wards this week. This work will continue over the next several weeks.
2. T. Hill Construction also replaced sidewalks in Ward 8 this week.
3. Arbor Masters re treated ash trees which were originally treated in 2021.

#### **Economic Development:**

1. Route 66 Scavenger Hunt: The City's First Place Winner, Mr. Steve Larson, was given his \$150 gift card from Vittoria on May 25, 2023. The City held a small event at Vittoria (16524 Manchester Rd) to award the prize to Mr. Larson.
2. The City met with the CEO of Spirit Bank, Nabil Cabbabe, to discuss the property located at 2675 Westglen Farms Dr. Spirit Bank is looking to purchase the property. Currently, Edward Jones has a lease within the building until 2026. If purchased, Spirit Bank would be opening a brick and mortar bank. More info to come.
3. Elaine Rosi Academy for Children (1725 Hwy 109) has officially closed. More info to come.
4. The Economic Development Committee met on May 25, 2023. I have provided a summary of the meeting below:
  - a. The Committee voted to re launch the Biking and Walking Benefits Program. The Department will be creating a page on the City's website to support the program. The Department will also be promoting the program on social media and providing program materials at City sponsored events. The Committee will be reviewing the program's progress during its meeting in November 2023.
  - b. The Department will be looking into adding booths to the Music on Main Concert Series. Local Wildwood restaurants would be able to utilize these

booths to sell food at the events. The Department will be checking in on the health and safety regulations that would apply.

- c. The Department will be putting together ad proofs for the Live, Work, Play Marketing Campaign. These proofs will be presented to the Economic Development Committee in June 2023.
- d. The Department will be looking into a potential Road Sponsorship Program. The Department will be speaking with the City Attorney about potential legal concerns with the program. More info to come.

**Administration:**

1. The Department has sent out the Waste Hauling Agreement to Republic Services and Gateway Disposal. More info to come.
2. The Department met with CM Brost and CM Ottenberg to discuss the City's investment policy. The Department will be presenting recommendations to the Admin/PW Committee in June.
3. The Department wanted to follow up on the MoDOT report from last week.
  - a. Regarding the sign on Hwy 100 heading towards Westglen Farms Dr: MoDOT's contractor picked up their sign last week. This sign is no longer present.
  - b. Regarding tall grass on Hwy 100: MoDOT completed mowing on Route 100 within the 4 lane section down to Route T.
4. This week, Waste Connections missed some collections within Ward 8 and Ward 7. Waste Connections reported that they missed around 150 homes throughout the week. The Department spoke with the City's Waste Connections representative, Ben Tucker, and he stated that they should be caught up by EOD on Friday, May 26, 2023. If Waste Connections doesn't get caught up by EOD today, they will be picking up any missed homes on Saturday. That being said, it seems that Waste Connections won't have any issues getting caught up. 5. The Department spoke with the City's legislative consultant, and he provided the following update on the Water Erosion Funding.
  - a. HB 19 is still waiting for the Governor's signature. However, the Office of Administration (OA) has already reached out requesting information and details on the desired projects. The Department and Mr. Silverman provided documents that detailed the project cost for the main creeks, along with links to the Watershed Erosion Task Force webpage, and the City's YouTube page. We also made OA aware that we have the \$125,000.00 funds budgeted ready to match the state's \$500,000.00. The City's consultant will also be reaching back out to the Governor's Budget Director, Alex Tuttle, to inquire about whether he needs more information on the matter.

1. The Planning and Zoning Commission will be considering, at its June 5, 2023, meeting, a recommendation from the Economic Development Committee of City Council regarding amendments to the regulations governing Temporary Banners. This discussion is in response to comments made at a recent Business Forum hosted by the City.
2. The Interim City Administrator and Senior Planner have been finalizing the steps relative to the solar energy system survey that was endorsed by the City Council at its last meeting to better gauge community opinions on this topic.
3. The Durga Temple's leadership has decided to forego the darker color on the exterior facades of the temple, which had been inadvertently placed on a portion of the building and will be repainting those areas with the hue that had been approved by the City's Architectural Review Board (ARB).

### **Parks and Recreation:**

1. The first concert in the 'Music on Main' Summer Concert Series is tonight, Friday, May 19, at 6:45pm. The band will be the *Fabulous Motown Revue*. All the fun will be on the large field just to the east of B&B Theatre. Hope to see you there!
2. The Plein Air Art Event art and photography is now being displayed in the atrium area of City Hall, on the first floor. The location this year was Babler State Park and all the talented participants found special places that you may recognize. Judging is planned for the week of May 22, 2023, with the awards ceremony will be held on Wednesday, June 14, 2023.
3. The Ribbon Cutting Ceremony at Bluff View Park is on Monday, May 22, at 6:00pm. The park has been upgraded and the bluff area over the Meramec River Valley is just stunning. Hope to see you there. *P.S. There will be ice cream served by Silver Spoons.*
4. The Planning and Parks Committee endorsed the relocation of the City Hall trash enclosure and Mayors' Grove to better integrate these existing features into Phase One of the Village Green. This report, with the recommendation, will be presented to the City Council in June.

### **Public Works:**

1. T. Hill Construction continued asphalt patching in various wards around the City. This work will continue over the next several weeks.

### **Economic Development:**

1. The owner of the property located at 16590 Manchester Rd, Gorjian Acquisitions, hired L3 Corporation to find a buyer or tenant for the property. L3 Corporation stated that Gorjian Acquisitions received an offer for the property. The Department met with L3 Corporation to discuss updates on the property. Currently, the prospective buyer is an orthodontist, and they are looking to convert the building into a medical office. L3 Corporation stated that the orthodontist received an extremely expensive quote for the demolition and remodeling. The orthodontist is also working to get financing. More info to come.
2. Route 66 Scavenger Hunt: The City's First Place Winner, Mr. Steve Larson, has chosen the \$150 gift card to Vittoria as his prize. He has agreed to meet City representatives at Vittoria on Thursday, May 25th, at 4:30pm to receive his prize.

3. The Department met with a representative from Schnucks. Schnucks (16580 Manchester Rd) will be renovating some portions of their store, and they will be remodeling their bathrooms. More info to come.
4. The City of Wildwood will be hosting its home based business exposition on July 15, 2023, from 8:00am to 12:00pm. The exposition will take place alongside the Farmers' Market.
5. The Department met with a representative from St. Croix Hospice, LLC (16759 Main St, Suite 208). St. Croix Hospice, LLC is planning to open on June 5, 2023. The Department is working with St. Croix Hospice, LLC to coordinate a ribbon cutting ceremony.

2. Currently, the elevator at City Hall is out of service, and will not be able to run until the City replaces the elevator's controller drive. The City had a TK Elevator come out to see how much it would cost to fix the elevator, and they quoted \$63,727.21 to replace the controller drive. The Department published an RFP on

Monday, May 15, 2023. The Department will be presenting options to the Mayor and City Council during the June Council meeting.

3. The Department has sent out a brief questionnaire asking the Mayor and City Council what objectives that they would like the City's legislative consultant to focus on during Missouri's 2024 General Session. You can still take the survey by visiting <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/CLF2FJ7>. Submissions will be due on Monday, May 22, 2023, at 4:00pm.
4. The Department has reached out to MoDOT regarding the following issues on Hwy 100:
  - a. Identifying when MoDOT will be mowing the median of Highway 100 west of Highway 109 to the intersection with Highway T.
  - b. Identifying when MoDOT will be mowing the edges of Highway 100 west of Highway T to the Franklin County border.
  - c. Repair of potholes along the left turn lane on Hwy 100 turning onto Taylor Rd.
  - d. Repair of four large potholes on Hwy 100 heading towards Hwy T.
  - e. Removal of a roadwork sign on Hwy 100 heading from Taylor Rd to Westglen Farms Dr.
5. The Department met with Spectrum to discuss the internet project. Currently, Spectrum is ahead of schedule when it comes to installing pipe for the fiber lines. Spectrum stated that they are quickly approaching 10% completion of Phase 1.
6. The Department spoke with the City's legislative consultant, and he provided the following update from Jefferson City.
  - a. Water Erosion Funding (HB 19, Section 19.381): This Bill is on the Governor's desk, and the City has submitted plans to the Missouri Office of Administration to let them know what the City would use this funding for. The City also confirmed with the Office of Administration that the City has the 25% match budgeted for 2023. More info to come.
  - b. TTDs and CIDs (SB 96): The Senate convened on Thursday, May 11th, to consider SB 96, sponsored by Senator Andrew Koenig (R 15) after the bill went to a conference committee because the Senate refused to concur with the House amendments added to the bill. SB 96 requires a two thirds majority vote if a special taxing district includes a proposed sales tax funding mechanism. There was pushback from both Republicans and Democrats regarding language that focuses on presidential primaries and other election policies. The Senate refused again to pass SB 96 with the House amendments and requested that the House take up and pass the

underlying bill that just focused on TTDs and CIDs. The House did not take up SB 96 by 6 pm today which was the end of the 2023 regular session. The bill failed to pass.

- c. Video Service Providers/Streaming Service (SB 275): The Senate took up SB 275 for consideration on Thursday, May 11th. This bill provides a sales tax exemption for the production of electricity. This bill has the video service provider/streaming language in it after it was added as a committee substitute in the House. The bill was reminded up for consideration when the Senate recessed for the night. The bill was brought up again today, but due to a filibuster, it was not voted upon and failed in the Senate chamber. SB 222 also contained the streaming language but failed to pass as well.
- d. The 2023 Missouri Legislative session ended on May 12, 2023, at 6:00pm.

#### **Planning and Development:**

1. The United States Geological Survey (USGS) provided an in person presentation to the Watershed Erosion Task Force on Wednesday, May 10<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Jessica LeRoy, the Study Leader, presented and identified a number of preliminary findings to the members of the task force. It is important to note the Strecker Road Triple Meander location has lost approximately twelve (12) feet of bank area to erosion from February to August 2022, a very brief period of time.
2. The consultant, Todd Wagner, will be in town Friday and Saturday, May 12 and 13, 2023, to begin the second stage of the engineering analysis on a total of seven (7) basins for possible retrofits, all being located upstream from the triple meander location. The trustees of the subdivisions, where the basins are located, were all invited to participate and walk with him during these individual investigations.

#### **Parks and Recreation:**

1. The first concert in the 'Music on Main' Summer Concert Series, will kick off a week from today, Friday, May 19<sup>th</sup>, at 6:45 p.m. The band will be the *Fabulous Motown Revue*. New banners for the overall 'Music on Main' Summer Concert Series have been added to Main Street in advance of the concert and remain there through the summer months.
2. The Plein Air Art Event was held on Saturday, May 6, 2023, at Babler State Park. Over fifty five (55) artists and photographers participated and each of them had the opportunity to submit two (2) of their paintings or photos for judging and cash prizes. B&B Theatres has graciously funded the prizes again this year!
3. The City hosted its Early Childhood Recreation Program (ECRP) this past week at the Wildwood Family YMCA. The theme of this event was "Get Your Hands Dirty"

and it was held at its community garden and led by Jodi Smedley. The kids had a great time and were also able to take home a plant for Mother's Day.

5. The City will be hosting a grand opening for Bluff View Park on Monday, May 22, 2023, from 6:00pm to 7:00pm.
6. The Department spoke with the City's legislative consultant, and he provided the following update from Jefferson City.



- a. Water Erosion Funding (HB 19, Section 19.381): Last Friday (May 5, 2023), HB 19 was Truly Agreed To and Finally Passed by both chambers of the Missouri State Legislature. This bill has not been signed into law by the Governor of Missouri. The Governor has 45 days from the date of passage to sign or veto the legislation. If HB 19 is signed by the Governor, the City will receive \$500,000.00 from the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. The City would have to match 25% of these funds (\$120,000.00).
