Background

In 2022, the Wildwood Historic Preservation Commission and Department of Planning compiled all the scenic drives from previous versions of the Points of Interest Map into one (1), large-size, foldable travel map final version. This new version was distributed at the 2022 Celebrate Wildwood Event, to Route 66 State Park and Babler State Park, The Wildwood Hotel, at Wildwood City Hall, and in every new resident packet over the past year. In total, 2,000 copies were ordered. By the time of this year's Celebrate Wildwood Event, it is anticipated that the City will have less than 200 copies of this original order left.

Updates and Reorder of the Map

Given the small quantity in its reserves, the Department of Planning is reordering another 2,000 maps (most cost-effective quantity) for the 2023 Celebrate Wildwood Event. Planner Keefe has been communicating with the Carqueville Printing Company regarding the order, and they have requested the updated version by the end of this month, if possible.

The Department is recommending the following updates:

- Add the Essen Log Cabin to it, now that its location has been decided.
- Add the Madison Valley Marker to the map, assuming a location has been decided.

- Update the Wildwood History Book image to reflect the final cover of the book, which now includes the Missouri Bicentennial Seal.
- Minor corrections to last year's version.
