Background

In 2022, the Wildwood Historic Preservation Commission and Department of Planning compiled all of the scenic drives from previous versions of the Points of Interest Map into one (1), large-size, foldable travel map final version. This new version was distributed at the 2022 Celebrate Wildwood Event, at Route 66 State Park and Babler State Park, The Wildwood Hotel, at Wildwood City Hall, and in every new resident packet over the past year. In total, 2,000 copies were ordered. By the time of this year's Celebrate Wildwood Event, it is anticipated the City will have less than 200 copies of this original order left. Thus, the Department is ordering another 2,000 copies of an updated version of the map for the 2023 Celebrate Wildwood Event, complete with a new Point of Interest (Essen Log Cabin), a new Historic Marker (Madison Valley), and an updated advertisement for the Wildwood History Book.
