I. ROLL CALL

A roll call was taken at 6:30 pm, with the above noted as present.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Council Member, Dave Bertolino to approve the minutes from the October 10 meeting. Board Member Lynette Baker seconded the motion. All present voted in favor and the motion was approved.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT

- A. Keith Reynold lives near Orville Road and must use this road daily to get to Eatherton Road. People who drive from Route 109 are often speeding and following too closely. He would like a three way stop sign at Orville Road, and where it meets Eatherton Road to the north and south. He feels that in winter, due to the steep in coming grade, a vehicle could slide off Orville Road through the Eatherton Road intersection without stopping. A stop-sign at the intersection would also slow traffic on Eatherton Road.
- B. Talayna Marce of Woodcliff Heights Drive returned to the Board to discuss two road concerns. 1. It is difficult to see oncoming traffic northbound Strecker Road from Woodcliff Heights Drive due to the fence and the wall. She stated that the stop line was possibly painted too far back in the intersection. 2. Woodcliff Heights Drive into the subdivision has a steep grade and cars are speeding up it.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. Woodcliff Heights Subdivision –Traffic Concerns

- 1.) The Board discussed traffic concerns in this subdivision.
- 2.) A motion was made by Council Member Dave Bertolino to recommend the installation of intersection warning signs for Woodcliff Heights on Strecker Road, from either direction, and to review the current position of the new stop bar in place on Woodcliff Heights Drive at Strecker Road. The motion was seconded by Board Member Lynette Baker. All present voted in favor and the motion was approved.

B. Eatherton Road Cut-Through Traffic Concerns

- 1.) The Board discussed traffic calming methods that might be suitable for Eatherton Road.
- 2.) A motion was made by Marshal Scott Collier for the Department to investigate the installation of a two-way, radar speed sign to tell drivers their current speed. The motion was seconded by Council Member Dave Bertolino. All present voted in favor and the motion was approved.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Review of 2020 Police Operating Budget and Police Services Agreement

- 1.) Reasons for the slight increase in police budget were discussed.
- 2.) A motion was made by Council Member Dave Bertolino to accept the recommendation for the 2020 Police Budget. Board Member Lynette Baker seconded the motion. All present members voted Aye.

B. Review of 5-Year Capital Improvement Program

Director of Public Works, Rick Brown, presented the 5-Year Capital Improvements Program for the City of Wildwood, as recently developed as part of the 2020 budget, to the Board.

C. City Priorities for Improvements on MoDOT Routes

- 1.) Director of Public Works, Rick Brown, discussed the list of City Priorities for Improvements on MoDOT Routes, with the Board. The Board discussed updating the list every 5 years, with possible additions to the list annually. This list provides guidance to MODOT, as well as the City of Wildwood when seeking federal funding for road projects.
- 2.) Board Member Lynette Baker asked to add a status column to the list, and to further define specific side road intersections that might be considered for lighting projects.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. Deer Management Subcommittee Update

- 1.) The Deer Management Subcommittee shared the current draft version of a survey that will be shared with the City of Wildwood, to gauge the public opinion about deer management.
- 2.) Board Members asked questions and provided feedback on revisions for survey questions.
- 3.) Board Member Lynette Baker made a motion to recommend that the draft survey go to City Council, for their information. Board Member Denny Welker seconded the motion, and all present voted in favor and the motion was approved.

VIII. ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by Board Member Denny Welker to adjourn and was seconded by Council Member Dave Bertolino. All were in favor. The meeting adjourned at 8:24 pm.
